IMMEDIATE PAST PRESIDENT JANE HALL AT WORK IN KYRGYZSTAN

Most everyone knows that one of past president **Jane Hall**'s passions is building houses in foreign lands with *Habitat for Humanity*. She just returned from Krygyzstan and at today's meeting *The Mill Wheel* asked her to tell us something about the trip and the photos we found on *Facebook*. Here is Jane's report:

"The first picture is of a gal named **Leslie Lethridge** and me examining 'artifacts' we uncovered while digging for rocks to put in between those two forms for the building. Before our 'dig,' Leslie and I spent two days bending and tying rebar.

"The next picture is of the group who were digging for the rocks. We have a box with the alleged artifacts we uncovered. To keep ourselves entertained, we named these particular items, which were actually just discarded junk.



"Last picture is of two sides of the house which we started to build up after spending most of our time doing the foundation, which was a royal pain because of all the big rocks we had to dig around. Two more teams will come in to complete the house. We worked on it for two weeks and they will each do the same. Note the mountains in the background—part of the Tien Shan mountains (Celestial Mountain in Mandarin). They run along the border between China and Kyrgyzstan.

"We worked in a small town called Barskoon, which is very near the biggest lake in Kyrgyzstan, called Issyk-Kul. A beautiful location, and many tourists from Russia and other former Russian satellites come there to vacation.

We all had a great time. More Rotarians should go on one of these fantastic builds! Who cares if there was only one bathroom for 16 people and a shower that merely sputtered to wash us off. We had a lake to jump in after a day's work in the dirt!

which also includes WHO (strategist), UNICEF (immunizer), CDC (on the ground work) and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (funder which matches 2:1 gifts from the Rotary clubs). Rotary International makes global grants from \$30,000 to \$200,000. District grants are matched 1:1 by International. Bob honored Susan Royce, who presented him with a \$1,000 check payable to the Rotary Foundation, and J. R. Hastings, who received a ruby pin (Paul Harris Fellow plus 5). With the new donation, Susan has a Paul Harris Fellow plus 6.

PROGRAM

■ Congressman Jared Huffman, elected to Congress in 2012, represents the six counties of Northern California from Marin up to the Oregon border. For six years, he was in the state assembly, worked with the Natural Resources Defense Council and was a member of the San Rafael Rotary Club.

He is the author of the Alaska Wilderness Bill, a bipartisan effort. Looking forward to September in DC when Congress votes on the Iran nuclear agreement and the visit of the Pope, **Jared** commented that Congress's list of accomplishments for the 2014-15 year has been dismal, at best.

As a member of the natural resources committee, he was the lead on the water bill and is also

on the transportation and infrastructure committee.

Following his presentation, members and guests asked questions about various issues:

How to ensure Iran follows through with the nuclear agreement (**Doug Scherf**) – onsite inspectors and cameras, limited amount of enrichment with limited number of centrifuges, self-inspection of areas already known to the US;

Obama's Clean Power Plan (Nancy McKlveen) – Sen. McConnell is asking foreign governments to disagree and state governments to not comply with the Clean Air Act;

Pilots' Bill of Rights (**Richard Rider**) – **Jared** is considering the bill;

ISIS (Dick Spotswood) – what can the US do? Go it alone?

Jared sees the US drifting and its policy in Syria incoherent. Turks are getting involved but they want to bomb the Kurds who are important US allies. We can't tell who the good guys and bad guys are anymore. Some groups fighting ISIS aren't any better;

Immigration (**Pablo Castro**) – Congress has a comprehensive, bipartisan bill and if it could bring it to the floor, it would pass.

NEXT WEEK

■ Dr. Lane Hirabayashi, UCLA professor of Asian-American studies, will speak on Taking a Principled Stand: The Story of Hirabayashi vs. the United States. He will share with us the incredible civil rights story of his uncle Gordon Hirabayashi, one of a handful of Japanese Americans nationwide to defy U.S. government curfew and "evacuation" orders issued in 1942. He was arrested, convicted, and imprisoned for a year, and eventually appealed his case to the U.S. Supreme Court. Although

the Supreme Court upheld his conviction at the time, the fight to overturn it resumed in the 1980s, culminating in his judicial vindication. In 2012 Hirabayashi was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

journalist – was released, but Jason Rezaian remains in custody. Iranian authorities have not disclosed the reason for his detention, though official comments by Iranian officials have "hinted at espionage."
