It wasn't always like that, though. One of the toughest things about his first months in America was the fact that he couldn't speak English. He and his father went to the library and rented cartoons which they watched to learn our language. Apparently, SpongeBob was an excellent teacher!

Mesgna's story was a fascinating tale, and we appreciate him and teacher Rod Septka for sharing it with us.
