
PROGRAM (Cont'd)

Next he went through cold weather training in the Army and skied to the North Pole. At that point he was just getting started. His goal was to summit the highest peaks on all seven continents and ski to both Poles. Last December he and a small party pulled 125 lb. sleds on a 450 mile trek to the South Pole. They raised money for Right at Home and Senior Access here in Marin. After the trek to the Pole, he then climbed the highest peak on Antarctica, Mt. Vinson, (16,050') to complete his goal. His

descriptions of the extreme weather conditions experienced on the trek had us all chilled and breathless by the end of his talk.
