
VISITORS

■ Dr. Angelo Capozzi, cofounder and volunteer surgeon of Rotaplast International, shared the remarkable story of the work done by the organization as it celebrates its 25th anniversary.

Started in 1992 as a world community service project by the Rotary Club of San Francisco, Rotaplast's first mission was to Chile to provide children with cleft lip and/or cleft palate reconstructive surgery.

Since then, Rotaplast has made close to 200 missions to 26 different countries and performed 19,000 reconstructive plastic surgeries. In 1996 Rotaplast was incorporated as an independent nonprofit and now has six paid staff. Many members of MV Rotary participate in the Rotaplast Bocce tournament in San Rafael every summer to help raise funds for their work.

Using personal anecdotes and photos showing dramatic transformations by young Rotaplast patients from all over the world, Dr. Capozzi certainly had the audience in his corner.



TOTAL AS OF TODAY: \$1,400.00 convicted of violating the segregation laws. Led by a young Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., the boycott lasted more than a year-during which Parks not coincidentally lost her job—and ended only when the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that bus segregation was unconstitutional. Over the next half-century, Parks became a nationally recognized symbol of dignity and strength in the struggle to end entrenched racial segregation. The U.S. Congress called her "the first lady of civil rights" and "the mother of the freedom movement "
