Mexican-American combat unit—the 36th Division, 141st Regiment, 2nd Battalion, Co. E.

Gutierrez spent four years on the research and compiled several individual stories to tell one incredible story of the U.S. Army battles in Italy during WWII.

His cousin Ramon from Del Rio, Texas was awarded the Silver Star and three Purple Hearts by the US Army. Captured by the enemy twice, he was able to escape and make it back across to Allied lines. He would also become one of only a handful of Americans to be decorated for valor on the battlefield by the Soviet Union during WWII.
