

Goals for the next District 5150 RYLA Camp, scheduled for April 4-6, 2014, include:

- 100 campers (80 this year)
- More volunteers on the staff
- District wide participation
- Increased youth sponsorships and contributions.

RYLA is an international Rotary program designed to stimulate leadership, citizenship and personal growth among its youthful participants.

Camper Kyle Wong reported that his experience was "amazing—camp helps you get out of your personal bubble and helps a lot with personal growth."


kayaks and paddle boards and children's games. The event will take place rain or shine, 11:30 a.m.
