Born in Greece during the Nazi occupation in World War II, she is the author of the book *New White Sandals* (Buy it here: http://





From 1941 to 1945 Germany occupied Greece. During the occupation a group of German soldiers came into her village, entered her home, looked around and then moved into Toula's family's home. They stayed for

many terrifying weeks. Living with no privacy or security during the occupation they prayed the enemy would not harm them.

They were not allowed to leave the house during that time, except for her mother once per week to bring back supplies. She discussed the way the occupation damaged not only her family but

her entire village. She compared it to the invasion and occupation of Greece during the Ottoman Empire.

Adding to their problems, when they didn't have Nazi related challenges, Greek Socialist guerrillas would come to call in the dark of night, forcing internment as soldiers on young people and adults alike and taking them to the mountains often never to be seen again.

Toula's 'eligible' family survived by hiding under dirt and leaves in the back of the barn, coming out only when the coast was clear of guerrillas. She eventually immigrated to the United States by posing as war orphans under the Marshall Plan (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Marshall Plan).


LET'S GO TO A CUBAN DANCE PARTY!

Chief **Angel Bernal** and Fire Chief **Jeff Davidson** will talk on *Public Safety*.



India Polio Free for 3 Years!

Throughout India and around the world, Rotary clubs are celebrating a major milestone: India has gone three years without a new case of polio. The last reported case was a two-year-old girl in West Bengal on 13 January 2011.

To mark this historic triumph, reached after a decades-long battle against polio, Rotary clubs illuminated landmarks and iconic structures throughout the country with four simple but powerful words, "India is polio free."
