

GIFT TO SERVICE FUND


❖ Past President **Kim Jessup** announced that the estate of her late parents has contributed

speaker, **Dale Miller**, president of the Golden Gate Electric Vehicle Association (GGVEA), you may have changed your mind.

According to Dale, electric cars cost less to drive than most of the gas guzzlers we drove to the meeting today. He noted that electricity costs about 3 cents per mile while gasoline for the average car is at least 15 cents per mile.

Additionally, electric cars require no oil changes, no filters, tuneups, no smog checks, equalling far lower maintenance costs. And they have the highest safety ratings and the most self driving features.

Charging is a pain, you say. Not to Dale Miller who says it is easy, convenient and cheap. The cheapest and most convenient place to charge is at home, he explained. To drive around the Bay Area, all you have to do is plug in the car where you park overnight. A regular outlet is

adequate for driving less than 40 miles per day every day, Dale said. Want a faster charge? Get an electrician to install a 240 volt charging connection similar to that required for an oven or clothes dryer.

As noted earlier in this issue, two classic electric vehicles—a Jaguar and a Tesla—were on

display in the clubhouse parking lot and were checked out pretty thoroughly by Mill Valley Rotarians on their way back to the office after the meeting.




extraordinary stories to emerge from the Battle of the Atlantic in WWII. We will be hearing this presentation on the 74th anniversary date of the U-505 capture.

June 11 (12:15): John Boessenecker will tell us about *Shotguns and Stagecoaches: The Brave Men Who Rode for Wells Fargo in the Wild West*, which is also the title of his book. The phrase "riding shotgun" was no teenage game to the men who guarded stagecoaches and trains in the Western frontier. Armed with sawed-off, double-barreled shotguns and an occasional revolver, these Wells Fargo messengers guarded valuable cargo through lawless terrain. They were tough, fighting men who risked their lives every time they climbed into the front boot of

a Concord coach. Among the great Wells Fargo men who guarded stages was detective **Steve Venard**, who in 1871 went undercover in Ukiah, Cloverdale, and Healdsburg, successfully infiltrating the **John Houx** gang of stage robbers. Another was **Henry C. Ward**, who was California's first stage driver during the Gold Rush, then served 30 years as a Wells Fargo shotgun messenger.



June 18 (12:15): Kate Johnston will talk about *Characters from the Early Days of San Quentin Prison*. Kate, who is a retired California State attorney who represented the condemned on California's death row as a Deputy State Public Defender, will share some of the colorful history of the State's oldest prison, including one of the earliest scandals surrounding the building of a wall. Her talk will highlight some of the characters from the prison's early days with stories about corrupt politicians, a female mob boss, a poet robber, **Mae West**, **Jack London**, and others.
