retiring, he became Executive Vice President for General Cable and worked in Saudi Arabia, UAE and Pakistan.

His goal in sharing his experiences was to help us see the Middle East through a different set of glasses.

Going back through the millennia, Rod started with a plague in 542, followed by the Roman Empire becoming the Holy Roman Empire and the defeat by Arab tribes of the Romans and Persians.

Fast forwarding to 1916, the British promised everyone in the region a little something, be they French, Russians, Arabs, in order to create a coalition against the Germans and Ottomans.

With or without this agreement, the Middle East was destined to become the mess that it is today with their societies organized by kinship and theocracy, as opposed to the developed world organized by democracy and oligarchy.

Analyzing the region in depth and with decades of experience, Rod sees the threat of a destabilized nuclear-power Pakistan with 180 million people, a direct challenge to the United States, unless we can help the Sunni Pashtu maintain stability.

If you'd like to do some reading on the subject, he recommends a book that traces the process that created the idea of one G-d, three religions and a succession of emperors, caliphs and kings.

The book is called, "In the Shadow of the Sword" by Tom Holland. It was a Sunday Times top ten bestseller in the UK and is available here too.
