Mill Valley Rotarians. What do you think?


- PP Pieter Bogaards and wife **Debra** cycled from Monterey to Cambria, returning home to celebrate their daughter's graduation from law school.

PROGRAM

■ Carlo Brayda, son of an Italian and grandson of an Ethiopian general, was our speaker today. He described an interesting slice of world history during a talk entitled "Destruction of a Peaceful Nation: Mussolini's Story of Treachery and

Deceit in the Conquest and Colonization of Ethiopia in the 1930s."

At the time of the European colonization and conquest of Africa, Carlo explained, Italy was falling short of its imperialistic ambitions. **Benito Mussolini**, Italy's Prime Minister, then dictator, was trying to re-establish its national pride after its First World War disappointments, and its failed first attempt at invading Ethiopia in 1896, when its army was obliterated.

In a desperate attempt to achieve victory, Italy unleashed mustard gas on military and civilian targets alike in utter defiance of the Geneva protocol.

Carlo's grandfather—General **Nassibu Zamanuel**—was one of Mussolini's foremost Ethiopian adversaries who perished from the gas after putting up a valiant defense.

Carlo's talk was a personal look at relationships between countries at the beginning of the break-up of the European colonies.

loss of more than 1,500 passengers and crew, making it one of the deadliest commercial peacetime maritime disasters in modern history.
