

A LETTER OF THANKS FROM CUTERVO, PERU*

Dearest Rotary Club of Mill Valley,

On behalf of our community in Cutervo, Perú, our mothers club, and the 50 young girls and the families that will be benefiting from the Soup Kitchen, I would like to sincerely thank the Rotary Club of Mill Valley for your generous donation and support.* We are very excited to announce that we plan to open the doors to our Soup Kitchen this coming July.

We met with the Mayor of Cutervo on April 28th to finalize all the last minute details of the space they are providing for our Soup Kitchen, which is located in the center of our town. Our engineers are working day & night to have the building ready by June 24th. Currently they are putting up the walls, and the bathrooms and kitchen are to be installed in the next few weeks.

Thankfully, we have also received great support from our local government. They have provided us with 3 agronomists that will teach the parents of our 50 young girls everything they need to know in order to start and maintain the greenhouse that we are building. As of 2 weeks ago we secured the land for the ¼ acre and within the next few days the agronomists & parents will begin building the greenhouse. The local government will also be

providing us with the cleaning staff for our soup kitchen.

I have weekly meetings with the mother's group every Wednesday night were we hand out weekly tasks. As of now we have finalized the group of girls that will be attending as well as the parents that will be working in the greenhouse and kitchen. Last week the mother's club interviewed 3 nutritionists and 2 chefs and by June 1st we should have the professionals needed to prepare a well-balanced menu.

On June 16th a group of mothers and I will travel to Lima to buy the equipment needed for the soup kitchen with the donations the Rotary Club has so kindly provided.*

Thank you again to the Rotary Club of Mill Valley for your generosity and commitment to the empowerment of women. We look forward to sending you more updates and pictures as we move forward in the process.

and conquest of Africa, Italy was falling short of its imperialistic ambitions. Benito Mussolini, Italy's Prime Minister, then Dictator, was trying to re-establish its national pride after its First World War disappointments, and its failed first attempt at invading Ethiopia in 1896, when its army was obliterated. In a desperate attempt to achieve victory, Italy unleashed its chemical weapon of mass destruction on military and civilian targets alike in utter defiance of the Geneva protocol. Carlo's grandfather-General Nassibu Zamanuel-was one of Mussolini's foremost Ethiopian adversaries who perished from mustard gas after putting up a valiant defense. General Nassibu is also

remembered for having penned His Majesty, Ethiopian Emperor **Haile Selassie**'s powerful speech to the League of Nations in 1936.
