PROGRAM


"Mill Valley is booming," enthused Mayor Stephanie
Moulton-Peters as she kicked off today's program. She and City
Manager Jim McCann teamed up to present the annual State of the City report.

The dynamic City duo painted a positive yet challenging picture of our favorite town, discussing subjects ranging from street improvements (love our new Miller Ave.!) to fire prevention and preparedness.

Naturally, traffic was part of the discussion, with emphasis on our ability or lack thereof to get out of and into town via East Blithedale and the Tiburon overpass. Looks like there might be good news there: the City is working with CalTrans, and plans are in the works to change the

single lane off and on ramps to double lanes, freeing up the flow at the freeway intersection.

With smoke still in the air from this summer's catastrophic firestorms, it was natural that the subject of fire prevention and preparedness took up a major portion of our speakers' time.

Removal of extremely flammable trees and shrubs, either by Mill Valley homeowners or the City if need be, looks to be a priority from now on.

Stephanie and Jim pointed out that Measure A funds were critical to the renewal of Miller Ave., and that the measure is up for renewal this coming election. Mill Valley streets are improving, with East Blithedale currently in the design stage of renovation up to Sunnyside, Jim McCann noted. Work on Throckmorton is expected to begin later this year.

City finances were detailed by the speakers, with pie-charts showing both revenues and expenditures. Property tax is still the big provider, accounting for 39 percent of 2018-2019 revenues and expected to provide 42 percent in 2019-2020.
