

- ◆ Respect the kids' ideas—what they want to do.
- ◆ Introduce them to networks that will help guide them.

- ◆ Teach them to write.
- ◆ Never say, "I told you so!" Let silence be its own lesson.

- ◆ Teach them how to serve. A lively question and answer session followed her presentation.

■ September 10: Paula Reynolds (Mill Valley Chamber of Commerce Chair) and Daniel Escalzo (Chamber Executive


Director) will bring a message titled *Mill Valley: A Chamber for the 21st Century.*
