



♣ To do good in the world—that's a major reason for joining Rotary. And, thanks to our visitors from Peru, those attending today's meeting got a first-hand report of how our Puno, Peru Greenhouse Project is positively affecting the lives of the people living there.

Joaquín de la Piedra, founder and president of *Kusimayo*, a partner in the Greenhouse Project, was introduced to the club by Immediate Past President **Bob Roberts**, who spearheaded our participation in the Rotary Global Grant Project.



PROGRAM (Cont'd)

Joaquín, who has an MBA from Boston College, explained that *Kusimayo* means "river of happiness" in Quechua, the local Puno language. His organization's goal, he said, is to "make a difference in the lives of children, families and the elderly in the rural communities of Puno."

Working with Kusimayo, Mill Valley and other Rotary clubs, using District Designated Funds

and Rotary International Global Grants, has had a role in the creation of 80 greenhouses that enable Puno families to grow many kinds of vegetables otherwise impossible to produce in the high altitude.


Joaquín calls this "Productive Puno" where families are now able to transform subsistence economies into ones of entrepreneurship." Families with the greenhouses harvest 60 percent of the crop for their own use while taking the remaining 40 percent to the market.

"You have positively affected 80 families. I don't know how to thank you for that," enthused Joaquín, who also shared details of other projects initiated and managed by *Kusimayo*.


The meeting ended with some words from **Betty Roberts**, who also has been to Puno and worked with Joaquín:

"Rotary's motto is **Service Above Self.** Joaquín and **Laura**


