PROGRAM

■ The speaker today was our own **Bill Lambrecht.** His topic—a visit in February 2013 to Bogota, Colombia. Bill represented the club during a Microcredit Program amongst the needy.

In some areas there is no water or electricity. 5 Million people are displaced, approximately onetenth of the total population and the result of 10 years of Civil War.

Bogota has an existing Rotary Club of approximately 20 motivated members with four projects already in place.

Loans are for a time period of 4 months and handed out to individual groups. A sum between \$50-\$300 is given out to small start up businesses, with a result of 97-100% repayment.

The project will be spreading out to other needy areas, partially supported by global grants.

To sum it up: Microcredit is a hand-up, not a hand-out!


Today's speaker—World Community Service Director Bill Lambrecht (left)—

CLUB CALENDAR


- *October 26*: Southern Marin Rotary Blood Drive at Mill Valley's Scout Hall.
