
would know how much money they had in the till. Bruce was president of the club in 1983-84. Thanks, Bruce, for your many contributions to our community and the world through those many years in Rotary.

Marinship was built at the extremely urgent request of the U.S. Maritime Commission to promptly replace ships sunk by German U-Boats and Japanese submarines during the opening phase of our involvement in World War II. As many as 80 ships per month were

being sunk and U.S. shipyard capacity had been decimated by the Depression in the 1930s, so on 2 March 1941 a request was made by the U.S. Maritime Commission for six entirely new shipyards. The request was telegraphed to the W. A. Bechtel Corp. in San Francisco and they immediately responded by proposing a shipyard at Sausalito. Construction began less than four

weeks later on 28 March and the first ship was launched less than six months after starting construction on 26 September.
