


GREETER



reliance on drugs in this country at the feet of the pharmaceutical industry and its enablers in Washington, D.C. where it is virtually impossible to pass any legislation restricting and/or regulating the use of drugs.

What to do? He pointed to the success of treatment programs in Portugal where dealers go to jail and addicts get help at clinics. These programs have shown great promise and could be adopted in the U.S., he said.
