

# Progress Report #3 Cutervo (Cajamarca) Soup Kitchen

❖ The student soup kitchen is a project that aims to improve the nutritional level of 50 young girls whose families are below the extreme poverty line. We are focusing on girls ages 13-17, who are currently enrolled in public schools in the urban area of Cutervo. These young girls were selected because most of them are from the countryside and walk an average of 2 hours to attend their classes; the idea is that this student soup kitchen will help improve their nutritional levels and thus their academic and physical performance. At the same time these young women and their mothers will be trained in food preparation with the idea of helping them to have access to new income-generating activities that will impact positively on their family income.

First, Installations of kitchen and dining room; second, preparation of a well-balanced menu based on local organic products; third, implementing educational sessions seeking the adoption of good eating and healthy habits; fourth, installation of greenhouse run by the mothers of the students involved in the project; and fifth, the implementation of a monitoring and evaluation program to measure the progress of the students and their families participating in the project. Mothers and/or guardians of the students will need to contribute with a minimal fee; their contribution can be monetary, with agricultural products; and or with their labor. The sales of the crops from the organic greenhouse will also help support the soup kitchen, as well as support from the local government and other different activities run by the Soup Kitchen committee. The project results will be reflected in improved levels of physical, mental and cognitive development of students.

The project is being run by the Mother Teresa of Calcutta committee, which is made up of 30 professional women who are community leaders, currently holding leadership roles in public service at various local institutions of Cutervo. As part of their commitment to serve, these women focus on the social development of their community and the promotion of women empowerment. The committee regularly performs incomegenerating activities, training for single mothers, and support for battered women and vulnerable families. The committee has seen the need to create a soup kitchen focused on improving the quality of life of female students in public schools in the area.

Total Cost is \$8,433 of which
Mill Valley Rotary Club will contribute \$3,970
