In his new book, *The Fighting Pattons*, **Brian** told us the behind the scenes story of not one but two **George Pattons** – the father, General **George S. Patton** from World War 2 fame, and his son Major General **George S. Patton** who served in Vietnam.

By chance, **Brian** noticed a photo of the retirement of a military leader, Major **George S. Patton**, son of the famous World War 2 leader, and was intrigued enough to start researching and eventually became the world's foremost **Patton** expert.

The senior **Patton** had dyslexia, was a pentathlon athlete (five different events including shooting

while riding) in the 1918 Olympics, chased **Pancho Villa** in Mexico under General **Pershing**, believed in reincarnation and had a few disagreements with Ike in the 1940s.


But his true claim to fame was his leadership of the Third Army in Europe in WW2, acclaimed as the best army in the history of the world. Patton was killed in a car accident just about the time his son was starting his own military career, earning accolades of bravery in Vietnam where he took remarkable personal risks in combat.

Since then, several generations of the **Patton** family have remained very engaged with veterans' groups, leading battlefield tours where the **Pattons** had served. A debt of gratitude to all.

March 15: Oak Dowling will talk about Bernard L. Madoff and the Largest Financial Fraud in History. Madoff committed the largest financial fraud in history with losses totaling over \$65 billion. In 2008 he was sentenced to 150 years in Federal prison. In the mid-1960s, Bernard Madoff tapped money at exclusive country clubs with the promise of steady guaranteed returns on their investments. He then set his sights on Europe and Latin America, brokering deals with powerful hedge fund managers and feeder funds from Buenos Aires to Geneva. Next it was

charities and union retirement funds. Billions of dollars were channeled to Madoff's investment firm, and his feeders became fabulously wealthy. The competition wondered how the man could produce such steady returns in good times and bad. There were allegations that Madoff was front-running or operating a Ponzi scheme, which the SEC investigated several times over the last two decades. But Madoff remained untouched until December 11, 2008, when he admitted it was all one big lie.
