

#### **PROGRAM**

■ Cooper Quintin, representing the Electronic Frontier Foundation (eff.org), presented a short-course in computer security and Web privacy basics.

Cooper suggested that there are four things you can do to improve your security:

- 1. Keep your software updated. He said that this is one of the most important things you can do to improve your computer security.
- 2. Have a good password. It is really important to have a strong password for each website that you have an account on. To make it easier, use a password manager, software that will generate and

- store passwords for each account you have on the internet.
- **3.** Keep your email secure and watch for malicious attachments. Use common sense; don't open attachments you are not expecting. If you must, Cooper suggests that you open it in Google Docs.
- 4. Secure your browser and get rid of those annoying ads. He recommends that you install a modern browser such as Firefox or Chrome followed by installation of a tracker blocking tool.
