president again in 2007-08. His favorite accomplishment as president is the club's project of annually hand delivering children's dictionaries to each and every one of 300-400 third graders in Pacifica.

Kevin and four other non Rotarians visited and learned about Finland together as a team and also made individual field trips. In spite of a temperature of 17 degrees below Fahrenheit they where able to make many interesting discoveries. Lots of bicycles were parked along the streets, but no locks attached. Everybody pays to belong to a church, but they seldom go to the services. Cut down birch trees were stacked along the roadside. but nobody took them to make a profit from their sale.

Schools and universities are free for everybody. All speak very good English which they pick up from watching American television programs. A normal class in school lasts for 45 minutes, followed by a 15 minute

break. Teachers in the group noticed that the students are more focused.

Finland has a population of 7.15 million and 40.000 islands, mostly inhabited by one family. The country was under Russian rule until 1920 with architecture similar to St. Petersburg, but since has developed its own style for houses with plain and functional interiors. Some of their favorite winter sports are ice fishing, driving a snowmobile, curling and cross country skiing.

After the presentation all club members where invited to pose in front of the Rotary banner and photographer **Gary Ferber** coaxed us all into a big smile!


CLUB CALENDAR
