The goal of PRLS, begun in 1993, is to provide a set of training sessions wherein current and future Rotary leaders could learn to become more effective in their leadership roles. The basic PRLS course consists of a one-day event covering five sessions: "Leadership," "Leading a Meeting," "Public Speaking," "Rotary, Your Club and You," and "Communications."

This program was specifically developed to train individuals whose goals include a future leadership position in Rotary. They learn skills that will make them more effective in that role. The instruction was carefully designed to improve individual leadership skills that are broad based and not just Rotary- specific. Participants have found substantial value in the many practical applications of information presented throughout the curriculum.

CLUB CALENDAR



At the age of six Mony Nop and his family escaped the reign of terror of the Khmer Rouge and the killing fields of Cambodia only to end up in hard scrabble refugee camps in Thailand and the Phillipines. He arrived in

■ November 19: Jonathan **Kathrein** has written a book titled *Surviving the Shark*. He is the shark survivor that marine scientist **John** McCosker talked about in his presentation last April. Jonathan was 16 years old when he was attacked by a shark while he was boogie boarding at Stinson Beach. Jonathan's story of survival is almost miraculous considering that the shark severed three of the four major muscles in his leg. The surgeons stopped counting after doing 400 stitches on his body. He bears a half circle on the front and back of his leg *that resembles the* front of a shark's mouth.
