#### **PROGRAM**

■ PP Bob Canepa introduced and thanked the League of Women Voters of Marin County for organizing today's Marin County Third District Supervisor Candidates' Forum.

Today's moderator was **Veda Florez** and the time keeper was **Linda Deer**. Both are directors of
the LWV and experienced in
presiding over Forums.

The program began with a three minute opening statement by each candidate: challenger **Susan Kirsch** of Mill Valley and incumbent supervisor **Kate Sears** of Sausalito.

Their opening statements introduced themselves to the audience by giving their backgrounds and qualifications for the supervisor's office.

The moderator then received and read questions from the audience. Each candidate was given 90 seconds to answer the question. The order of answering alternated.

Sixteen excellent questions were presented, touching on topics such as the Alto Tunnel, traffic and development (particularly in Strawberry), sea level rise and shoreline protection, rent control, homeless issues, housing, pensions, pesticide use in open spaces, and unions.

Finally, each candidate made a three minute closing statement in which they summed up the main themes of their candidacy.

The forum provided much information about the candidates and the issues in Marin.

Veda Florez thanked the candidates and the club for hosting the forum. She reminded the audience that May 23<sup>rd</sup> is the last day to register for this year's county elections, to be held of June 7<sup>th</sup> and to access the League of Women Voters website at marinlwv.org for more election information.

**President Ken** added his thank yous before adjourning the very successful meeting.

She lived in a remote village in the South West Region of Cameroon in Central Africa for over two years conducting health education. Allely spearheaded a variety of health campaigns while she was there, ranging from nutrition to epilepsy to water sanitation.
