PROGRAM

■ Our speaker today was Jonathan Westerling, founder of Radio Sausalito to be heard on 1610AM.

Radio Sausalito is a big band jazz and blues station, one of only three in the Bay Area. Besides music it broadcasts local information and, if needed, emergency communication.

The station had its humble beginnings when Jonathan listened to jazz in his kitchen on an old high school transmitter. Neighbors listened, the word got around and in 2002 he opened his first modest studio. In 2005 he changed from FM to AM for better signal reception. Today his studio is in the basement of the "Pines" in Sausalito.

The station is totally automated, the shows are prerecorded and he has 6 repeaters, a physical antenna of 0.1 watt power, one of them on top of Sausalito City Hall.

Jonathan pointed out why radio is so special—It is the only ubiquitous entertainment, it is portable, it is happening now, it speaks to you personally, allows multitasking and it is free.

A community station is a resource of important local information and has an emergency alert system.

However, today a transition to new technology is taking place and Internet Radio is rapidly growing. He invited everyone to



■ January 21: Toula Siakotos will talk about her book *New White Sandals: A Greek Memoir.* She will be sharing her experiences as a child during the




Nazi occupation of Greece in WWII and the bloody civil war that followed.
