
JOKE OF THE DAY

BOARD MEETING UPDATE

✤ The Board of Directors, at its most recent meeting, worked on the budget for the upcoming 20-21 Rotary year. President Lee noted that the projected loss for this fiscal year is about \$3,000 or less. Next year the plan is to break even, even with a cloudy crystal ball making it difficult to foresee a Mountain Play and the resumption of regular luncheon meetings. Lee asked for any "safe in-person" ideas.

The board also made two regular grants: \$2,000 to Marin Villages and \$10,000 to 10,000 Degrees. The latter grant will provide scholarships to four students. President Lee noted that these grants are possible because of your giving to the Mill Valley Rotary Service Fund (George Hoyle) over the years.

President Lee reported that the District Awards Regatta (District Governor Sue Rokaw is an avid sailor) is scheduled for Saturday, June 13. This will be an on-line event and you must register to attend. Use the link below.

SERVICE FUND SUPPORT

The big news at today's meeting was President Lee's report of the response to his recent challenge to match funds provided by the Mill Valley Rotary Service Fund to support

giving to needy organizations during the Covid-19 pandemic. The challenge was for members to come up with more than \$2,400 to be matched by the Service Fund. Lee reported that the club members responded with donations totaling \$3,850! That means that \$7,700 is available for grants in addition to the total of \$20,600 made in May.

Lee thanked the club for its generous response while noting that contributions are still welcome. The Four-Way Test of the things we think, say or do

JUNE 16: TURKEY-U.S. RELATIONS IN A NEW MIDDLE EAST


