

BJ recommended we all think about where we want to die (home? hospice? hospital?). Bruce Wrisley mentioned he has a POLST in a plastic container in his fridge with a sticker on his front door alerting people to it. Catherine Keyes said she is developing a hospice home in Marin in memory of her father Charley who was a longtime member of Mill Valley Rotary.


# CLUB CALENDAR (Contd)


• August 27: Cindy McCauley and some members of the Tam High contingent that earlier this year went to play baseball in Cuba will share some of their travel and baseball experiences.
