

PROGRAM

BUILDING GREENHOUSES IN PERU'S HIGH ANDES

■ President-elect **Bob Roberts** and immediate past president **Kent Campbell,** recently returned from an on-site visit to the Altiplano of Puno, Peru, brought us up to date on the construction and effectiveness of greenhouses being built in the High Andes north of Lake Titicaca, thanks to a Rotary Global Grant arranged by the Rotary Club of Los Altos and our club in cooperation with the RC of El Rimac in Lima.

The Rotary Club of Mill Valley—joined by a host of other clubs in the San Francisco Bay Area who contributed Designated District Funds (DDF) to the project—raised



greenhouses high in the mountains of Peru to help bring people there from a subsistence level existence to a

market oriented one. Partnering with

two Peruvian nongovernmental organizations (NGOs), Kusimayo and the Instituto de Alternativa Agraria, the program enables people in









the mountains to grow food for themselves, solving childhood anemia problems along the way, and sell the remainder in local markets for income.

PROGRAM (Cont'd)

Bob and Kent were accompanied last month on the trip to Peru by **President J. R. Hastings** and his friend **Anna Marie**, Kent's son Liam, Bob's wife **Betty** and **Dan Hatch**.

During his presentation, Bob singled out Past President **Doug Scherf**, whose recent stint as Foundation Chair helped build up our club's DDF, and our current International Director **Bill Lambrecht** for their contributions to the project.

The two Peruvian NGOs and the Rotary Club of El Rimac in Lima work directly with the local communities where the greenhouses are being built by individual families. Kusimayo works directly with the people seeing that all the rules are being obeyed. The Institute de Alternativa Agraria provides equipment and technical know-how.

To qualify to build one of the 16-ft. by 65-ft. adobe greenhouses, a family must have water available, be able to make the bricks needed, and then build the greenhouse. Bob noted that of the 22 greenhouses constructed to date only one has failed.

Kent's professional quality video wrapped up the program. In it he thanked the following Rotary clubs for their participation in this important overseas project:


