✤ Sanja Kulenovic first came to the U.S. from her hometown of Sarajevo as an exchange student. After her marriage in 1992 she returned to Southern California on her honeymoon where she and her husband were stranded as a result of the Siege of Sarajevo. She now resides in Pasadena and has become a U.S. citizen.


Surviving in this country initially by cleaning houses, Sanja had to wait months before determining the fate of her family. With the help of a ham radio operator she was able to chat with her father for 30 seconds, finding out that everyone was alive.


Later, she received her first letter from her father. It was followed by many others during the 1,425 days of the siege. "The letters became my life," she said.

Ten years later, the letters, translated to English, became the foundation for her book, *The Siege of Sarajevo*.

Sanja shared literally a book full of stories of survival, giving us a firsthand look at how a family and others "never gave up."




NEXT: "ANGEL ISLAND, GUARDIAN OF THE WESTERN GATE"

✦ January 19: State Park Interpreter John Claggett will present Angel Island, Guardian of the Western Gate. John will provide a live program from the US Immigration Station, Angel Island. The walls of the historic detention barracks are filled with poetry, written and carved by

immigrants expressing their feelings of frustration, anger, and hope. Historically called the "Guardian of the Western Gate" by immigration staff, the station is second in size only to Ellis Island in New York. The detention facility was built to enforce immigration laws of the era including the Chinese Exclusion Act. People from over 80 countries, were detained on Angel Island between 1910-1940, the largest groups were immigrants from China, Japan, Russia, and India. Poem written by a Chinese immigrant appearing on the East Wall of Room 105:

It's been a long time since I left my home village; Who could know I'd end up imprisoned in a wooden building? I'm heartsick when I see my reflection, my handkerchief is soaked in tears; I ask you, what crime did I commit to deserve this?
