Dick's car will be attached to Amtrak's Coast Daylight at Oakland for the southbound trip to Santa Barbara. There is room for 32 passengers—16 southbound on the 7th with a different 16 northbound on the 8th. The plan is that participants will either fly or ride the regular Amtrak train on one leg of the trip.

■ Photographer **Bob David** took us on a fascinating tour behind the scenes of the Golden Gate Bridge's development and operation. In a presentation titled *Golden Gate Bridge: An Inside View—Art, Architecture & Photography,* Bob told us some stories we had never heard about our favorite bridge.

Few people have come to know the Golden Gate Bridge, inside and out, as extensively as Bob David. An architect and photographer, he began his career at the Bridge in 1973. For his first 30 years at the Bridge, he served as Design Director for the agency, which includes the operation of the Bridge itself plus the Golden Gate Transit Bus and Ferry system. He and his design team produced all the public



information graphics and display hardware for the transit system and the bridge. He continues working in a semi-retired status, focusing on documentary photography of Bridge projects.

As a special treat, Bob sold copies of two of his bridge photos, donating half of the proceeds to the Mill Valley Rotary Service Fund, which netted a total of \$190. We thank you, Bob!


