GOOD TIMES



Mill Valley Rotarian **Dr. Isaac** (**Ike**) **Silberman** spoke about his Five Ouestion Guide instead.

Dr. Silberman discussed how our bodies are so connected and that we artificially separate things into physical, physiological and other groups. Diagnoses are often wrong because of this separation. For example, physiological causes can be missed if psychological causes are instantly assumed. Todays medical solutions are linear. Isaac offered a circular 'whole-health' process that relies on a collaborative approach using a group of people including at least one trusted friend. The rest of the group includes professionals such as MDs, a person's personal network, and a call center network.

Together the group asks five questions about things like a person's central nervous system, skeleton and skin, work, spirituality and more, before discussing options and arriving at a diagnosis. The approach ultimately provides medical information and choices from a group of people looking at an individual's problem.

This collaborative Five Question approach enables people to save money, time and get a better diagnosis without pursuing a traditional linear approach. For more information, contact Ike at 415-235-7805.



April 15: Linda Naugle will talk about UNICEF and Polio.


April 22: Member's Program.
