■ Bob also reported that the club has received the full Rotary global grant of \$93,200 which is dedicated to the Puno, Peru greenhouse project. He further reported that he and International Director Bill Lambrecht have transferred \$52,339 of the grant monies to our partner Kusimayo, a nonprofit association that has been working since 2008 in rural areas of the provinces of Lampa and Puno, Peru. According to Bob, this first payment covers the purchase of materials required to construct 35 greenhouses. There will be further disbursement's for

agricultural supplies and for trainers.

 Another report from PE Bob: The club is negotiating with the City of Mill Valley regarding future use of the golf clubhouse. The city wants to be able to rent it to as many people as possible, while the club desires to continue its schedule as best as possible. It is expected that the two parties will be able to work out a mutually satisfactory use schedule. Stay tuned!

world at the North American Youth Exchange Conference. Commonly known as NAYEN, the exchange is a Regional Association representing 167 Rotary districts, in Canada, Mexico and the United States, which are involved in Rotary Youth Exchange.

The annual three-day conference provides a forum for training youth exchange officers in best practices and the opportunity for interaction and collaboration with our overseas counterparts. NAYEN further supports its members through the development of resources and training materials to support their district programs.

This year's conference was hosted by Rotary District 5650. Jane noted that youth exchange officers from South America, Europe and Asia also attended. Jane told the club that the event offered a wonderful opportunity to learn best practices of the various districts and to network with many, many Rotarians. She said over 600 attended.


CELEBRATIONS
