NEW MEMBER



PROGRAM

■ Elizabeth Suzuki introduced our speaker Kim Mazzuca, president of 10.000 Degrees, a San Rafael based nonprofit organization that selects Mill Valley Rotary Tamalpais High school scholarship recipients. Her presentation was entitled "Creating College Graduates Who Will Change the World."

First she thanked Mill Valley Rotary for supporting 8 students this year. She stressed that long before kids need funds to go to college they need something more profound - Self Belief.

The goal at 10,000 Degrees is to help students from low income communities to believe in and achieve their dreams. Eight-four percent of their students graduate from four-year colleges and 10.000 degrees is closing in on a goal of putting 10.000 kids each year on the path to a college degree.

What drives them? First their strong conviction that every kid, regardless of race or economic status, deserves an equal shot at a degree, and the fulfillment and opportunity that comes with it.

Second, the fact that the California economy urgently needs more college graduates. And third, the grim reality that we are losing the battle against poverty.

She pointed out that the poverty level in Marin is growing faster than its population with an increase of 55%. Huge progress has been made in the year 2013, but still there is no time to rest and so much more to be done.



April 15: Linda Naugle will talk about *UNICEF and Polio*.


April 22: Member's Program.
