

photos and the stories from their award-winning film, "Surviving Skokie," about neo-Nazis effort to march in the town which had many Holocaust survivors living there after the end of the war. Eli's father, born in Poland, was 16 when the war ended and the only member of his family to survive. He explained to his son that Jews had to survive twice first the camps and then when they arrived in Chicago. The neo-Nazis ended up marching in Chicago, not Skokie. Eli's father, now 85, lives in Denver. Eli and Blair are taking their film to Paris and Berlin for showings.

■ January 19: Fletcher
Christian, Captain Bligh & The
HMS Bounty will be the subject
of Tony Probst's talk. Tony is a
world traveler and a big collector
of historical artifacts. Back in
1789, British sailors in the Pacific
mutinied on the HMS Bounty and
settled on Tahiti and Pitcairn
Island. While the mutineers on
Tahiti were later arrested by the
British, those on Pitcairn were
able to start a community with
Tahitian companions.

In 1838, the Pitcairn Islands officially became a British territory. This should be a fascinating program.

 Barrington's presentation has the intriguing title *The Bishop Wears*No Drawers. This is also the title of his book, which is about his own true harrowing survival tale, adventures and challenges as a Catholic missionary priest in war torn Nigeria for 10 years.
- **■** February 2: Oak Dowling's presentation is entitled Al Capone One of the Most Notorious Gangsters in History. Capone was an American gangster who attained fame during the Prohibition era as the co-founder and boss of the Chicago Outfit. His seven-year reign as crime boss ended when he was 33 years old. Capone is one of the most notorious American gangsters of the 20th century and has been the subject of numerous articles, books, and films. His personality and character have been used in fiction as a model for crime lords and criminal masterminds ever since his death. The stereotypical image of a mobster wearing a blue pinstriped suit and tilted fedora is based on photos of Capone.
- February 9: Robert Heller's presentation is entitled *The* Unlikely Governor. This is also the title of his book. In a true American odyssey, Belvedere resident Robert Heller chronicles his journey from the caves and cellars of war-ravaged Germany to the United States and his rise as Governor of the Federal Reserve Board and President and CEO of VISA U.S.A. His humorous and candid memoir concludes with an insider's observations of what transpires in America's boardrooms.
- February 16: Our very own Bob Roberts will present *Wish You Were Here*, which is also the title of his book. Bob will be
