
• Einar Asbo introduced his wife Liv.

Supporting the Community – MV Rotary Gives Local Scout an Assist with his Eagle Project

For my Eagle Scout Project, we built a chicken run in Marin City to benefit the MLK Jr. Academy (a K-8 school). In addition to benefitting the school, it also benefits a non-profit program run by the gardener/ teacher at the school (Catherine Wolfers), called the Conscious Kitchen, that provides needy children with free health food options for lunch and breakfast.

By building a chicken run, we built a home for the three chickens that they will bring in to teach the kids about how to maintain and care for animals as well as provide the garden with eggs.

We also improved the garden by weeding (removing blackberry brambles, thistle, and dandelions), reorganizing the shed and areas surrounding the shed, and relocating a persimmon tree.

I had over 40 volunteers from my troop, Troop 1 (Mill Valley), and over 220 man hours involved. Personally, it took lots of time and planning and preparation, but I was happy and proud to have finished the project. The chicken run was beautiful, the garden looks amazing, and all of that hard work certainly paid off.
