

once rode a motorcycle 10,000 miles in 28 days.

More recently he trekked the 40 miles of the Salkantay Trail up to Machu Picchu which was built as a resort for the Inca ruler.

Crossing through Inca ruins in the Sacred Valley (now a UNESCO World Heritage Site), he witnessed endangered Andean condors, alpacas and llamas, ate small roasted animals usually seen in local pet shops and was blessed by a shaman in an ancient Inca ceremony.

At an altitude of fifteen thousand feet and once hidden by jungle, Machu Picchu was never seen by the Spanish conquistadors who within 40 years had destroyed the Inca civilization. Probably for the best that they never found jungle-covered Machu Picchu.
