 will join us to participate in a



■ Today's speaker was Chris Austria, a wildlife conservationist living in East Africa. Chris is originally from San Francisco and worked with tigers and lions for many years at Six Flags in Vallejo.

He has conducted numerous film projects with big cats for National Geographic, Discovery Chanel,

Jack Hanna and Animal Planet. He has also worked as a Tiger Analyst for ABC and has been featured on NightLine, The early show.

At present he works for the Ngamba Island chimpanzee sanctuary in Uganda. It was founded by Dr. Jane Goodall, and is home to 49 orphaned chimpanzees that have been rescued from the illegal wildlife trade.

Without their care it is unlikely for the animals to survive or to be reintroduced to the wild. The island was established in October 1998 and encompasses 100 acres of rainforest. It is situated a short boat ride from Entebbe, near the Equator in Lake Victoria. It provides a rich diversity of wildlife and natural food for the chimpanzees. The sanctuary is open all year round to visitors who pay a nominal entrance fee to view one or both of the chimpanzee feedings. Day and overnight visits are also available in luxury tents.

April 19: Retired British General Rod Macdonald will speak on Misunderstanding the Middle East. He will cover the formation of the Middle East from 1914 along with the difference between Middle Eastern and Western societies based on his experiences of more than 14 years working in the region. He believes that not having this knowledge creates misunderstanding which can drive poor decision making both at the political and business level. Prior to this he led British forces in active service in Northern Ireland during multiple tours in the 1970s and later saw combat in the Falklands War.

May 3: Cooper Quinton will teach us Cyber Self-Defense for Beginners. Surfing the web or even just owning a computer might seem like a dangerous proposition. One could have the impression that the internet is teeming with identity thieves, con artists, spies, creeps, and criminals. In this talk Cooper will show you the five simple things that cyber-security professionals do to protect themselves online. Best of all, you can do these things yourself, at home, right now and never again fear your computer.

May 10: Allely Albert is a recently returned Peace Corps Volunteer originally from Mill Valley. She graduated from Willamette University in Salem, OR, where she studied French and American Studies. Allely was admitted into the Peace Corps and began her service in Cameroon in September 2013. She lived in a remote village in the South West Region of Cameroon in Central Africa for over two years conducting health education. Allely spearheaded a variety of health campaigns while she was there, ranging from nutrition to epilepsy to water sanitation.

May 24: Ann Mahony will present *The Amazing Handkerchief: Chronicler of History, Heroism, Romance, Fashion, and Art through the Ages.* The handkerchief is with us in large and small moments of life – wrapping a child's cut finger, catching a bride's tears of joy, worn over a soldier's heart into battle. Their history dates back to

1000 BC, and they were originally reserved for kings and nobility. In the month of May, when we honor our servicemen on Memorial Day, we'll view silk handkerchiefs from WWI, handkerchiefs printed with escape maps and tide tables from WWII, and more. Come discover what stories and memories are hidden in the folds of a treasured handkerchief. Ann Mahony is a historian of vintage artifacts and has a handkerchief collection of 5,000+, including several over a century old.
