#### **PROGRAM**

■ Bob Canepa introduced our State of the City Speakers Mayor Ken Wachtel and City Manager Jim McCann who spoke about key areas of concern including traffic, emergency preparedness, expanding communication efforts, Miller Avenue update, housing element, streets and sewers, municipal service tax, homeless services, single use plastic bags, smoking regulations, downtown restroom, lateral sewer ordinance, SASM master plan, planning and building activities, sea level rise vulnerability, post-employment benefits, citizen involvement, recent meetings and city finances.

Key points include: A traffic study committee comprised of **Stephanie Moulton-Peters, Mike McGuire, Mark Levine,**

# **PROGRAM Cont'd**

CalTrans and MV chamber reps will begin work this month, solving what is not a local issue but a regional issue caused by "us" – students, parents, FedEx, service workers, etc.

The annual evacuation drill was held this May including a family campout at the MV Community Center field where folks will likely camp out during a real emergency.

The MVFD is in the top 1/10<sup>th</sup> of 1% in the state. Expanding City communications include live webcasts of council meetings which are now interactive in real time, full use of social media including FaceBook, Twitter, NextDoor, MVConnect via signups on the City website, "Let's Stay in Touch" chats with council members on Lytton Plaza.

Work on Miller Avenue is starting this year, guided by an advisory committee. \$3.5 million in rehab funds are being directed towards improving roadways for both cyclists and drivers on Camino Alto, \$14 million for Miller Ave. and additional funds to renovate the Golf Course Club House parking lot!

In addition, a successful campaign has raised \$850,000 to renovate the tennis courts with private contributions ranging from \$40 to \$20,000! A study committee has been appointed for the municipal service tax use.

Greater enforcement is underway for the multi-use path. The City is working on a facility for homeless services in collaboration with the MVPD, Council, County and Council of Mayors. Don't count on single use plastic bags anymore as BYOB is the new watchword. Only dry

cleaners will be using single use plastic bags. Paper bags will now cost a dime.

You can no longer smoke on the sidewalks unless you are walking (who knew?). Groundbreaking for the Lytton Plaza public restroom will be this year. The City is waiting for a cost estimate.

New regs in store to test the sewer lateral when selling properties or planning remodeling costing more than \$50,000. Twenty million is designated to update our sewer system which represents 15-17% increase in sewer fees.

The City planning department will better control construction management through new rules, times of truck deliveries, better enforcement, etc.

A subcommittee will make recommendations to the council about pension obligations.

### **PROGRAM Cont'd**

There is extensive citizen engagement on boards, committees, commissions, etc. Recent city meetings have included MVSD Superintendent, neighborhood association leaders, annual committee meetings of the library, park and rec, community center, etc.

A discussion of Airbnb is underway. Good news re. our finances – MV is not Stockton! (or Detroit, or San Bernardino, or Vallejo, or......). We have a Triple A credit rating and 25% in general fund reserves, a two year budget 2014-16 in place, funding for 5 years of capital improvements, a long-term financial plan, pension reform and more.

Our major sources of revenue are property and sales tax (\$38 million) and expenses of \$39 million are largely allocated to capital improvements and quality of life enhancements (library, park and rec, etc.).
