GOOD TIMES



May 22 (12:15): Keith Phillips will present Leaving No One Behind: a Mill Valley Effort to Recover America's War Dead. There are 83,000 Missing in Action (MIAs) service personnel from World War II, Korea, Vietnam and the Cold War. A Military History buff, Keith first developed an interest in the MIAs when in New Guinea a local tribal chief asked him to bring home some American remains in his village. From that starting point began a sense of mission to re-energize the country's efforts to locate and recover the remains, and through Project Homecoming to assist families in their efforts. During his time with us Keith will speak to the "facts and figures" associated with the missing, speak to their presence in Marin County and worldwide and discuss the combination of science, international goodwill and serendipity that all play a role in return of the missing.

May 29 (12:15): Film editor and film maker Tim Amyx will present Movies in Marin and San Francisco. The movie palaces of yesteryear, and the modern movie theaters of Marin.
