October 24: John Geoghegan's presentation is entitled *West Coast Sub Attacks During WWII*. The California coast was swarming with Japanese submarines in the weeks immediately following the attack on Pearl Harbor. Between December 10, 1941 and October 1942, nine Japanese submarines sunk a dozen merchant ships between Vancouver and San Diego as well as shelling the California coast on more than one occasion—episodes little remembered today.

October 31: Dr. Tom Peters will discuss The Face of Modern Philanthropy in Marin and Beyond. Dr. Peters is President and CEO of the Marin Community Foundation (MCF). He will share an insider's view of the billion-dollar philanthropic enterprise based here in Marin County, and how the mission of the MCF is expressed in grants made locally, nationally and internationally. He'll give us a sense of the operational, advisory and decision-making mechanisms that support these multi-million dollar charitable distributions. And in the process, he'll also reference the public policy and federal tax context of this process designed to guide private resources to the benefit of the public good.
