PROGRAM

■ PP Bob Canepa introduced **Tony Probst**, our speaker for the day.

Tony's presentation was on Fletcher Christian, Captain Bligh & The HMS Bounty. Tony has been going to sea since age six when he accompanied his family on a 14 year sailing trip. He became fascinated with the story of the HMS Bounty after reading Mutiny on the Bounty. He has collected over 3000 photographs and artifacts from the Bounty as

well as the *Titanic*. Tony discussed his many visits to Pitcairn Island, where the Bounty landed. Approximately 50 people inhabit the island and make most of their livelihood from the few annual tourist visits. Tony dived to the remains of the Bounty many times and showed us some of the artifacts he brought home. Many other artifacts are on display at his showroom at 647 Francisco Blvd E., in San Rafael. His program about this tiny island (the size of our Angel Island) its history and its inhabitants was simply amazing.

Capone was an American gangster who attained fame during the Prohibition era as the co-founder and boss of the Chicago Outfit. His seven-year reign as crime boss ended when he was 33 years

old. Capone is one of the most notorious American gangsters of the 20th century and has been the subject of numerous articles, books, and films. His personality and character have been used in fiction as a model for crime lords and criminal masterminds ever since his death. The stereotypical image of a mobster wearing a blue pinstriped suit and tilted fedora is based on photos of Capone.

■ February 9: Robert Heller's presentation is entitled *The Unlikely Governor.* This is also the title of his book. In a true American odvssev. Belvedere resident Robert Heller chronicles his journey from the caves and cellars of war-ravaged Germany to the United States and his rise as Governor of the Federal Reserve Board and President and CEO of VISA U.S.A. His humorous and

candid memoir concludes with an insider's observations of what transpires in America's boardrooms.

- **February 16:** Our very own **Bob Roberts** will present *Wish* You Were Here, which is also the title of his book. Bob will be talking about the fascinating life and work of his father Mike Roberts, which spanned more than 50 years. A self-taught pioneer in the development of color photography and printing, Mike was known as America's Postcard King.
