PROGRAM

♣ Another fascinating journey into the past as Historian John Freeman provided an account of the arrival and celebration in the Bay Area of Teddy Roosevelt's Great White Fleet.

The fleet left Hampton
Roads, Virginia in December
1907 and traveled around South
America, and into the Pacific
Ocean. In each of the ports it
stopped along our coast, the fleet
—carrying 7,000 sailors—was
hosted and toasted with an
exuberant show of patriotism and
pride, culminating with the fleet



entering the Golden Gate on May 6, 1908, where an estimated crowd of a million people thronged to get a look at the 16 battleships.

The San Francisco Bay Area hosted one of the finest receptions our navy has ever seen with spectacular parades, grand balls, banquets, and lots of exciting activities, including a trip up Mt. Tam on the Crookedest Railway, for all the sailors. The visit of the fleet was the first major public celebration of San Francisco's recovery from the earthquake and fire.


