Working with **Greg Davison**, School to Career Liaison for the Tamalpais Union High School District, and San Andreas High Principal **David Luongo**, **Karen Buckter**, **Burnett Tregoning** and club Youth Director **Doug Scherf** helped plan the event. Mill Valley Rotarians **Steve Miller**, **Richard Rider** and **Kent Campbell** participated as three of the 11 "sample businesses" set up at tables in the school's courtyard to answer questions by the students. **Robin Keller** also joined the Mill Valley crew to assist with lunchtime chores. Doug Scherf's son **Jeff**, a San Andreas alum, was a keynote speaker.

The event was designed to give participating students plenty of opportunity to talk with the business representatives and ask questions about jobs—what's available now and what they might have to do to obtain a job that appeals to them. The lunch provided by MV Rotary featured a wide variety of pizza, plus green salad and fresh fruit.

Greg Davison noted that many students commented, "I did not realize I could work in X industry (Dental Assistant, Home Care, Green businesses, etc.) NOW, right out of high school."

"San Andreas was very humbled by the support provided by Mill Valley Rotary," he said. "We all look forward to doing this again," he added.
