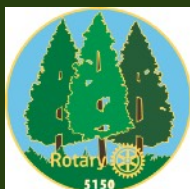

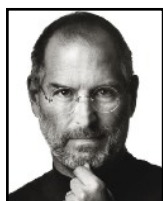

6. The next lunch meeting will be a Zoom presentation on February 1st. The monthly evening meetings are on hold until the Covid virus pattern becomes less risky.

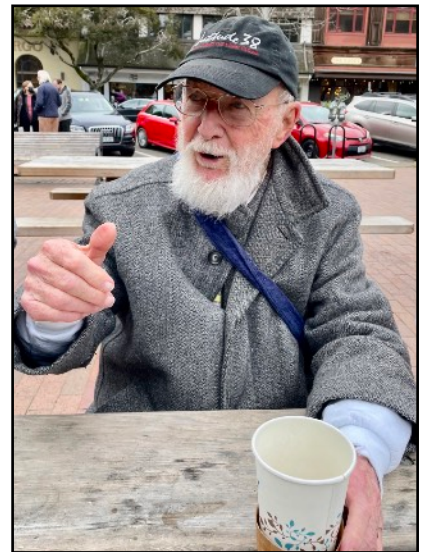
GOOD TIMES

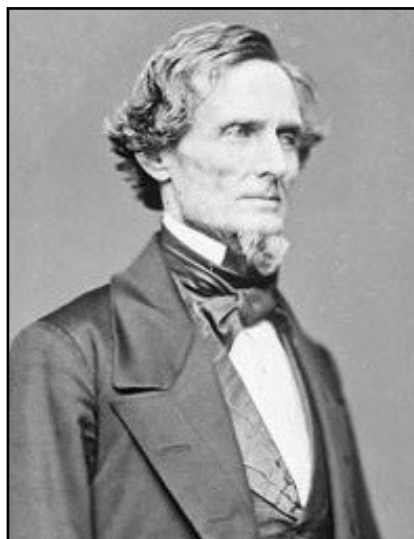

world or a permanent or temporary resident in the U.S. with a green card or tourist visa.



Levying war is an internal rebellion, with an army and an

attempt to overthrow the government. Were the tax rebellion and whisky rebellion levying war? Were they treason? Undecided.

On the other hand, espionage is not treason because it is committed against non-enemies and not during war time. As for treason, the speaker mentioned Benedict Arnold, Aaron Burr, Jefferson Davis, Lord Haha and Tokyo Rose.

Jefferson Davis (shown at left) had an impressive political career before the Civil War. He was indicted for treason but could not be tried because no jury in Virginia would convict him. He was eventually pardoned by President Andrew Johnson.

Tokyo Rose (upper right) attended UCLA and moved to Japan to help an elderly aunt. On her radio program, she never



engaged in propaganda or provided military secrets. The Justice Department determined there was no basis for charges.

Later, she interviewed for articles about her career as Tokyo Rose and the Truman Administration did prosecute her. She was convicted and spent six years in prison.

After a very informative presentation by Professor Larson, President Lisán adjourned the meeting.

February 1: Rear Admiral **Michael Baker** will present *International Friction Zones Leading the USA to World War 4*. Conflicts fester in numerous locations around the globe where people die every day. Rising nationalism and ethnic strife can cause any of these to erupt into a major conflict leading to a nuclear exchange. The United Nations notes 10 million refugees on the move at present, a Covid-19 pandemic is raging, commerce is disrupted, and global warming progressively disrupts ecosystems. All signs, according to Rear Admiral Baker, point to a potential for World War 4 over limited resources.
